The origins of the movement can be found within a nondescript administrative building in Cold Spring Harbor, New York, under the direction of Charles Benedict Davenport from 1910 to 1939.

Spotlight on History:

Longwood and the Long Island Rail Road

On April 24, 1834, Yaphank resident James H. Weeks, who would later serve as president of the Long Island Rail Road from 1847 to 1850, signed the charter for the Long Island Rail Road along with 11 other men, and construction began in 1836. Over the next several years, the line was built in stages, and soon the railway had nine stations, including Medford and Yaphank, which opened June 26, 1844. A month later, in July 1844, the Greenport stop opened, and the railroad was complete. The new rail route had a major impact on eastern Long Island, since a three-day trip overland from Greenport to Brooklyn now took about three and a half hours by train. In the Longwood community, this meant more people from the city established farms and homes in the area. A well-documented example of this is when William Bartlett, a prominent lawyer in New York City at the time, leased a farm in Middle Island, where the Spring Lake Golf Course now stands. Over time, Bartlett expanded the farm's size to 1,000 acres by purchasing additional acreage and even went so far as to build a spur from the railroad to his estate. In his diaries from his time growing up on the farm, William's son Willard often mentions visiting the Yaphank Station to pick up mail, goods, and supplies, as well as to greet visitors. Willard, who would inherit the land from his father, later became a noted lawyer and Judge on the New York Court of Appeals.

With the railroad, commerce now flowed quickly to and from the city, with local general stores receiving goods and supplies and farmers sending produce and cordwood to city markets. In addition, due to the close proximity to the Yaphank, Wading River, and Manorville Stations, thousands of acres in Ridge were chosen for the establishment of Camp Upton in 1917. Workers and building supplies were brought to the site through a specially built spur in Yaphank. Once the camp was built, soldiers were transported to and from Upton via the LIRR. Even the mules used by the US Army at the time were transported on special train cars. Today, the site is known as Brookhaven National Laboratory.

The railroad also helped to create new communities in our district. Ten years after the construction of Camp Upton, land in Yaphank was purchased by Louis Fife, who subsequently established Gordon Heights. Since the community was closer to the station in Medford, people could travel to and from their homes in the city with ease. Since summers were spent out in Gordon Heights, mail was forwarded to the station where the seasonal residents could pick it up. As a result, parts of Gordon Heights now have the Medford zip code.

Although the railroad brought benefits, it also brought some trouble. Farmers along the line became bitter because sparks from the locomotives set area forests on fire, which threatened the local cordwood industry. Animals were not only killed by the trains, but were startled by the clatter of wheels and shrieking whistles. As a result, local farmers pulled stakes and tore up tracks, and the situation became so severe that the Long Island Rail Road sent handcars ahead of the trains with men to inspect the tracks for damage. Peace was finally restored when the officials began to pay out cash for damages.

While not without its faults, the railroad played a significant role in shaping our community. From its initial charter signed by a Yaphank resident to the establishment of Camp Upton and Gordon Heights as well as other communities in the area, the Long Island Rail Road brought people to and from the city to our towns, first to visit, then to summer, and eventually to stay. Although its impact waned over the years, for a time, the LIRR tied the east end and our district closer to the commerce and communities of New York City and beyond.
