Spotlight on History: Longwood and the American Revolution

This year marks the 250th anniversary of American independence. While the signing of the Declaration and the resulting war often evokes images of Philadelphia, Lexington, and Boston, the ramifications of that decision were felt right here in what would one day become the Longwood community.

The revolutionary tide pulled many local men into the conflict. Nearly 60 men enlisted in militias to fight in early engagements on Long Island or turned to the waterways as privateers, ferrying crucial intelligence and supplies across the Sound to Connecticut. The political rupture was not only international but also personal, creating deep fissures between friends, families, and neighbors who chose to support the Patriot cause and those who remained loyal to the Crown.

Following the American defeat at the Battle of Brooklyn in August 1776, Long Island was occupied by the British. This status would last until the war's end, a full seven years under British military control. To assert dominance, the British forces marched down Middle Country Road (then called King's Road) to the East End, effectively bringing the war right to the doorsteps of our community. The area's hamlets were inundated with troops who were often quartered in private residences. Residents were forced to

surrender essential livestock and supplies without receiving compensation. Those who managed to flee to Connecticut faced the brutal hardships of being wartime refugees. This era placed a heavy burden on our community, marked by constant vigilance against the British occupiers.

However, this seven-year military grip was constantly challenged by active resistance. While many Patriots fled to Connecticut, organized defiance continued on the ground. This included small acts of sabotage and rebellion. Setauket, a crucial part of our region, served as the mainland anchor for the famed Culper Spy Ring, whose local agents risked execution daily to feed vital information to General Washington. Furthermore, American forces launched targeted raids from Connecticut across the Sound. In November 1780, Major Benjamin Tallmadge led a daring nighttime raid, marching his dragoons from Mt. Sinai, through the Longwood community, to destroy the British-held Fort St. George in Mastic. On the return trip, Tallmadge's troops deliberately burned over 300 tons of hay stockpiled for the British cavalry in Coram. These actions forced the British to divert critical resources just to maintain control. The American cause prevailed through that perseverance, founding our nation, and for the next two and a half centuries, the Longwood community grew alongside it. To commemorate this history, we'll spend the coming year exploring the profound impact of the Revolutionary period on our residents and the legacies they forged.

2026 marks the 250th anniversary of the United States, and the Longwood Public Library is celebrating with a series of special programs. Keep an eye out for the "America 250" designation to discover programs and events that explore the rich history of our nation.

We're also commemorating the year by documenting the many milestones in our community. This effort will include in a visual time capsule called "Longwood 250: Our Story," which will be created from photos contributed by our community members. 
