Born a Crime: Stories from a South African Childhood by Trevor Noah

Trevor Noah's unlikely path from apartheid South Africa to the desk of *The Daily Show* began with a criminal act: his birth. Trevor was born to a white Swiss father and a black Xhosa mother at a time when such a union was punishable by five years in prison. Norwegian by Night by Derek Miller

Part memory novel, part police procedural, part sociopolitical tract and part existential meditation, Miller's first novel features an unlikely hero: Sheldon Horowitz, an 82-year-old widower suffering from dementia. After witnessing a murder in Oslo, Horowitz, a former Marine sniper and watch repairman, flees to safety with the newly orphaned son of the killer's victim and becomes haunted by memories of his own son who died in Vietnam.
