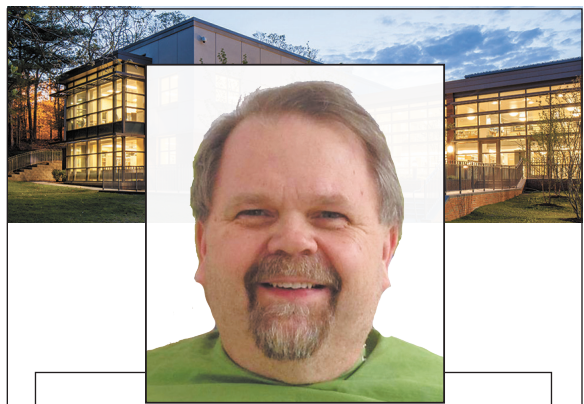

We will miss him forever.

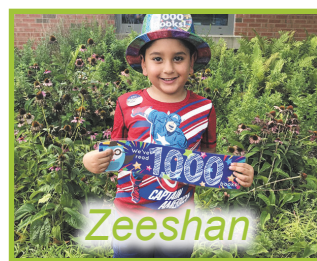
Library Update

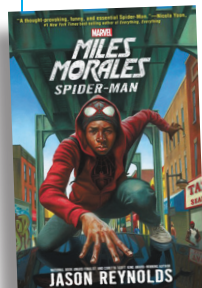
Book Club for 9th-12th Graders
