Petitions may be picked up in the Director's office, beginning Monday, February 7. They must be submitted with a minimum of 25 district resident signatures. The trustee election coincides with the library budget vote which will be conducted by paper ballot at the library on Tuesday, April 5, 2022. The newly-elected trustee will serve a five-year term, beginning July 2022.
